Teachers to maintain 2 metre safe space at all times including with staff. Extra caution for teachers who are pregnant and in third trimester. To avoid hand sanitization queues – hand washing, as advised by government is strictly monitored and is compulsory for all students and staff at the prescribed times and at any other time a student leaves or returns to the working space. Hand sanitization products are allowed to be brought from home. Clear rules are sent to all parents. Procedure to be reviewed by HT and LT member each day as issues arise. All students and staff briefed fully on procedures. In case of infection HT to build a list of seating plans to identify close contacts of infected individual (within 2 metres) on seating plan and to interview infected students to identify close contacts associations at lunch/ break. These students will then be asked to test each day but still attend school.

				This list will then be discussed with PHE/ DFE and advise taken in case of wider outbreak. Staff maintaining 2 metres at all times + wearing mask significantly reduces risk of infection. Pregnant staff to be particularly aware of this and to inform the LT if there are any barriers/ concerns in doing this.
