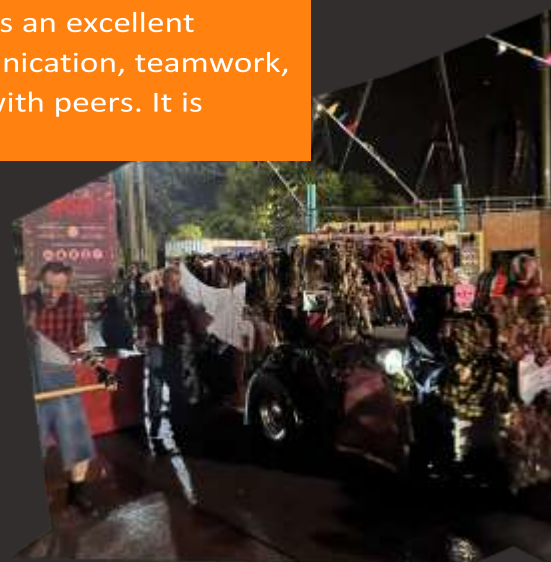
SIXTH FORM CULTURE TRIP TO LONDON
